<p>Newspaper, catalogs, phone books with covers, non-glossy advertising materials</p> <p>Cardboard & Brown Bags Ribbed cardboard (corrugated), Brown grocery bags, beverage cases, and cereal boxes</p> <p>Magazines, glossy catalogs & glossy ads</p>	<p>Loose</p> <p>Flatten boxes to save space.</p>	<p>Remove & discard plastic liners or wrappers.</p> <p>KEEP DRY.</p>	<p>⊘ wax-coated material</p> <p>⊘ packing material (Styrofoam, plastic bags, strapping)</p> <p>⊘ food waste</p>
<p>Glass Containers Jars & bottles only</p>	<p>Remove lids. (Recycle if tin or aluminum.)</p> <p>Rinse clean.</p> <p>No need to remove labels.</p>	<p>Rinse well to remove food waste.</p> <p>Don't need to remove labels.</p>	<p>⊘ light bulbs or tubes</p> <p>⊘ dishes or glasses</p> <p>⊘ windows or mirror glass</p>
<p>Tin cans (steel) Food cans, empty steel paint cans & aerosol cans</p>	<p>Rinse clean.</p> <p>Remove labels.</p> <p>Cans may be flattened to save space.</p> <p>Do NOT puncture aerosol cans.</p>	<p>Paint cans must be empty and clean.</p> <p>Aerosol cans should be emptied by normal use.</p>	<p>⊘ ceramics</p> <p>No garbage or food waste should be left in cardboard, paper, glass, tin,</p>
<p>Aluminum cans, trays, pans, foil and aluminum bottle caps</p>	<p>Rinse all items.</p> <p>Clean food waste from foil & pie pans.</p>	<p>Cans may be flattened to save space.</p>	<p>aluminum, or plastic containers.</p>
<p>Plastic Only containers marked</p> <p> OR  PETE HDPE</p>	<p>Remove & discard plastic lids.</p> <p>Rinse clean.</p> <p>Flatten to save space.</p> <p>Remove metal handles.</p>	<p>Soda & liquor bottles: some other hard clear bottles.</p> <p>Bottles & pails (milk, juice, soap, shampoo)</p>	<p>⊘ No motor oil or antifreeze containers.</p>

All recyclable materials are placed in the same dumpster and do not need to be sorted.
